

## Community Connections with Adult Providers – CCAP

The Community Connections with Adult Providers Program is part of the Roswell Independent School District. It is available to students who have completed the 4-year, 23 credit portion of their high school but receive a Certificate of Transition rather than a diploma. With the Certificate of Transition, there is a follow-up Transition Plan that is created by the IEP team to address transitional goals that need to be addressed and achieved in order for the student to earn his/her diploma. Follow-up Transition Plans usually include exposure to many community agencies with a linkage to the agencies appropriate to the individual student. These include job coaching, community based instruction for transportation, shopping, utilizing community resources such as utilities, health services, and independent living activities. CCAP is designed for individualized transition planning and educational opportunities, the world or work, and independent living for

students with disabilities that have not completed all of their IEP goals for transition.

### Frequently Asked Questions:

#### Are you part of the RISD? – Yes

CCAP is a part of the Special Services Program for RISD. CCAP is not a part of Goddard or Roswell High School.

#### Who may participate in CCAP?

Students with disabilities whose IEP team has identified transition goals, which have not been met in order to earn their diploma. According to the **New Mexico Standards for Excellence**, students on a Career Readiness Pathway must earn the minimum number of credits, standard or alternative, meet the established target scores on state graduation examination(s), and **achieve competency in all areas of the career readiness standards with benchmarks as determined by the IEP team.**

**Students on the Ability Pathway must meet or surpass IEP goals and objectives, ...referencing skill attainment at a student's ability level, which may lead to meaningful employment,...and achieve a level of competency pre-determined by the IEP team on the current graduation examination(s) or alternate assessment.**

#### What age group does the program serve?

Ages 18 – 22.

#### Where is CCAP located?

AESC – Special Services

#### Are there specific requirements? – Yes

The student on Career Readiness or Ability Pathway must have completed the credits and testing portion of the graduation requirements. It is not for any

students on Standard Pathway. CCAP focuses on transition needs.

How many staff work at CCAP?

There is 1 certified teacher and 2 job coaches.

How many students are at CCAP?

Student population varies as students attain their goals and transition to work sites, post-secondary education, and adult living in the community. Numbers usually range from 7 – 14.
