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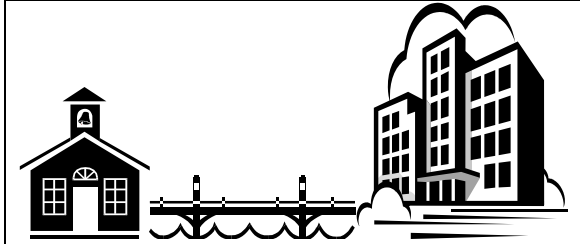

Project Succeed Transition is providing new options for students with disabilities as they transition from high school to the community.

Project Succeed Transition Services

- We contact the employer regarding Project Succeed Transition and discuss available work experiences at the work place.
- We analyze the job for specific tasks. This is an important tool with enables the employer, job trainers, and school support staff to expedite the training on the job.
- We match the student's skills, interests, abilities, and other characteristics to an appropriate job.
- We provide initial training and instruction to the student on the job.
- We provide assistance and new skills training to the worker when needed.
- We provide ongoing consulting services in training student workers.
- We provide training in independent living and work skills development.

Benefits to the Employer

- Time and money are saved on recruiting qualified employees. Students are thoroughly screened and evaluated before they are placed on the job.
- On the job training may be provided to teach and monitor work performance when needed.
- Employers may eventually earn tax credits for employing individuals with disabilities.
- Employers become part of an important school / business partnership that assures students a successful transition from school to adult living.
- Employers get support in training student employees.
- Employers learn new training ideas.

Benefits to the Students

- Students participate productively in society, gaining skills that will assist them toward adult independence.
- Students who are hired earn income that will help achieve independent living.
- Students are matched to a job assuring that employers & students benefit from services.
- Students develop the confidence and self-esteem associated with holding a job.
- Students learn new job skills that will improve their employability.
